

What is DelDOT Doing? The NPDES Program:

- Inventories and inspects the storm sewer system
- Samples stormwater outfalls for pollutants
- Sweeps all DelDOT-owned streets
- Researches and implements pollutant-reducing structures
- Inspects facilities and construction sites for environmental compliance
- Keeps the storm sewer system clean and functioning
- Educates and engages the public about stormwater

Why is DelDOT Doing This?

DelDOT is working to improve the quality of stormwater runoff. In 2001, DelDOT and New Castle County were issued a Stormwater Permit from DE Department of Natural Resources and Environmental Control to control stromwater pollution discharge in New Castle County.



STORMWATER ISSUE

Storm drains and roadside ditches lead directly—without treatment—to our streams, rivers, and bays.

As we replace our natural landscapes with asphalt, buildings, and roadways stormwater can't soak into the ground.

During a storm event, runoff can pick up pollutants like **sediment** from construction sites, **nutrients** from excess

fertilizer use, bacteria from pet waste, **oil and grease** from motor vehicles, and become polluted.
