

STORM WATER carries pollutants from our yards, streets, and sidewalks into storm drains, which empty into local waterways without any treatment...

Fertilize lightly, and never right before a rainstorm. Substitute chemical fertilizers and pesticides with products that contain natural ingredients.

Service your car regularly to prevent leaks. Recycle antifreeze and motor oil — dumping a single quart of oil down the storm drain can create a two acre oil slick.

Put dog waste in the toilet or trash can; it adds disease-causing bacteria to our waterways.

Wash your car on the lawn, so the soapy water doesn't run down the storm drain.

Bag or compost leaves and other yard waste; don't allow leaves to collect in the street.

Place litter in proper trash receptacles or take to your local recycling center.
