








FY23 - Sources of Funds - \$1,019.8M




FY23 - Uses of Funds - \$1,019.8M (in millions)





New CTP Program: Resiliency & Sustainability

- \$17.7M over 5 years
- Strategically deploy electric vehicle (EV) charging infrastructure and establish an interconnected network to facilitate data collection, access, and reliability

New CTP Program: Resiliency & Sustainability

- \$48.5M over 5 years
- To be used for planning, resilience improvements, community resilience and evacuation routes, and at-risk coastal infrastructure
- Division of Resiliency and Sustainability will develop a project prioritization process

New CTP Program: Carbon Reduction

- \$27.1M over 5 years
- Funding for projects to reduce transportation emissions or the development of carbon reduction strategies
- DelDOT will work with MPO's to develop a carbon reduction strategy

- \$225M over 5 years
- Increase overall size and value of Bridge Program that includes Preservation, Management, Painting, and Inspection
