The Chesapeake and Delaware (C&D) Canal was first conceived of as early as 1654 when Swedish governor John Rising suggested it in a letter to his superiors. The first survey of possible canal routes, conducted by the American Philosophical Society in Philadelphia, took place in 1769. Work on the canal in its current location began in earnest in 1824, and the canal was opened to navigation in 1829. At that time, the canal was 10 feet deep with a bottom width of 36 feet, and traversed 13.625 miles; it cost around \$2.25 million to build.

Improvements to the canal have been made at various times. The canal was purchased by the Federal government in 1919 and designated the "Intra-coastal waterway Delaware River to Chesapeake Bay, Delaware and Maryland." At this time the infrastructure included six bridges and a railroad span; these were replaced during the 1920s by four vertical lift spans and a new railroad bridge. Improvements took place during the 1920s, 1935-1938, and in the 1960s-1970s. The canal has been managed by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (Wilmington District, then Philadelphia District since 1933) since 1919.

The canal crossing at Summit, Delaware was one of the original four bridges over the canal; this covered wooden bridge spanned the "Deep Cut" and measured 250 feet between abutments. The wooden bridge was replaced with a pivot bridge in 1872, which in turn was replaced in 1926 with an iron vertical lift bridge.

The current steel and concrete cantilever truss Summit Bridge was constructed in 1957-1959, and carries four lanes of traffic on Route 896 over the C&D Canal. The bridge received the most beautiful bridge award from the American Institute of Steel Construction in 1960.
