

ABSTRACT

This cultural resources report details the findings of an archaeological and historic architectural survey conducted by URS Greiner Woodward Clyde (URSGWC) for the Delaware Department of Transportation (DelDOT), in response to the proposed intersection improvements of Route 41 and Brackenville Road in New Castle County. No existing archaeological sites within the project area are presently on file at the Delaware State Historic Preservation Office (DE SHPO) and no new archaeological sites were located during the current study. Therefore, no additional archaeological investigations are recommended within the project area. Two standing resources, a dwelling and its carriage house, both of which are more than 50 years old, were identified and assessed within the project's historic architecture Area of Potential Effect (APE). The Chandler-Taylor House and its associated carriage house are located at the intersection of Brackenville Road and Old Lancaster Pike. However, due to substantial modifications and the removal of associated agricultural buildings, they are not recommended as eligible for listing in the National Register of Historic Places
