- The fair treatment and meaningful involvement of all people regardless of race, color, national origin or income with respect to the development implementation and Environmental Justice (EJ)
 - The last treatment and meaningful involvement or all people regardless of race, contained and origin or income with respect to the development, implementation and enforcement of environmental laws regulations and policies nauonal origin or income with respect to the development, imended in the development of environmental laws, regulations and policies. No group of people should bear a disproportionate share of the negative environmental consequences resulting from industrial governmental and commercial operations or

 - No group of people should bear a disproportionate share of the negative environmenta consequences resulting from industrial, governmental and commercial operations or policies

 - Meaningful Involvement
- People have an opportunity to participate in decisions about activities that may affect their environment and/or health;

 The publicle generalization are included. • The public's contribution can influence the regulatory agency's decision; Community concerns will be considered in the decision-making process; and • Community Concerns will be considered in the decision-making Process, and
 • Decision makers will seek out and facilitate the involvement of those potentially affected

- Presidential Executive Order 14008: Tackling the Climate Crisis at Home & Abroad
 - Signed January 27,2021
 - Included the "Justice40 Initiative"
- Justice 40 Initiative
- "Government-wide initiative that aims to deliver 40 percent of the overall benefits of relevant federal investments to disadvantages communities."



- Created the "Justice Forty Oversight Committee" Created the "Justice Forty Oversight Committee"

 "Established to study and make findings and recommendations regarding environmental justice in this State"
- Composed of 15 Members

- Three (3) members from the House of Representatives

- DHSS
- Div of Public Regulation DE State Housing Authority
- Dept. of Agriculture
- White House Environmental Justice


EI, JUSTICE40 and DELDOT


In Delaware, how do we define "disadvantaged communities"?

Disadvantaged Communities




- Goals

 - Standardized tool for DelDOT (and other state agencies)





5-year Summary Block Group data



 132 Total EJ Neighborhood Groups
 - Massachusetts's Energy & Environmental Affairs
 EJ methodology
 - > % of Median Household Income
 - ➤ 318 Total Neighborhood Groups
 - Incorporated Indigenous & Native American persons into minority group analysis




- DelDOT Methodology: Moderate & Significant
 - % of Population in Poverty is greater than the State Average AND the population of African Americans, Hispanics, Asians, or Native Americans are greater than 2x or 3x the State Average, OR
 - Combined population of minorities is greater than 2x or 3x the State Average, OR
 - % of population in poverty is greater than 2x or 3x the State Average, OR
 - O MHHI (family of four) is less than or equal to \$45,985 or \$28,070.




Findings


- o Statewide:
 - 162 Equity Focus Areas
 - 100 Moderate, 62 Significant
- New Castle: 67 Moderate, 54 Significant
- o Kent: 16 Moderate, 3 Significant
- o Sussex: 17 Moderate, 5 Significant



- Other Data Sources
 - Language Isolation
 - 18 Total Neighborhood Groups
 - o 7 Moderate, 4 Significant
 - Aging Population Percentage
 - Delaware State Housing Authority



- 31% live below poverty rate





FY 2021 Grants under the Areas of Persistent Poverty Program

- August 2021, DTC submitted grant application to FTA
- Identifying and prioritizing critical public transportation enhancements
- Create better access to opportunity through public outreach and informed technical analysis
- June 2022, FTA awarded DTC \$630,000
- With required local match, project estimated at \$700,000



Goals and Objectives—Transit Planning Technical Analysis Improving public transportation to a transit-dependent community in the following areas:


- Transit planning and evaluating fixed-route bus improvements
- Micro transit initiatives
- Better, safer, and enhanced connections to transit for the area's communities, i.e. missing sidewalks, rapidly moving through traffic and few crosswalks
- Identify needed transit amenities and improvements such as benches, shelters, lighting




Improving public transportation to a transit-dependent community in the following areas:

- Identify resilience concerns: flood prevention and stormwater management
- Study truck traffic contribution to modal conflicts with buses, creating safety hazards for pedestrians and transit users
- Complete Streets to devise a sound strategy of multimodal corridor improvements to augment enhancements identified in other studies, plans,& projects (WILMAPCO's Southbridge Transportation Action Plan (STAP); Route 9 Corridor Master Plan and DelDOT's RAISE grant)







Micro Transit

DART Connect: Delaware's first on-demand microtransit service

- Pilot launched April 2021 in Georgetown and Millsboro
- Uses smaller vehicles
- Same Day On-Demand Rides
 - App booking
 - Phone booking
 - No "hailing"
- Flexible routing
- Affordable, convenient connections
- Customized app





Mobility

DART Connect

- Since Launch in April 2021 (Jan. 2023)
 - 34,946 rides
 - 4,065 DART Connect accounts
 - 54% of rides booked in app
 - Average ride: 15 min
 - Average ride distance: 6 mi
 - Average walk distance: 108 ft
 - 31% of time, riders are on board with another person
