# Legislation

In 1996, the General Assembly passed legislation enabling DelDOT to develop a program to protect corridors serving

"predominantly statewide and/or regional travel" (Section 145 of Title 17 of the Delaware Code).

# Corridors in the Program

SR 1 – Dover Air Force Base south to Nassau (31 miles)

US 13 - Route 10 in Camden south to Maryland (46 miles)

US 113 - Milford south to Maryland (33 miles)

SR 48 – Hercules Road to Route 41 (2 miles)

### Goals

Maintain a road's ability to handle traffic safely and efficiently
Minimize the impacts of increased economic development
Preserve the ability to make future improvements
Sort Local and Through traffic via service roads

## Access Decisions are based upon land-use

In undeveloped areas, the policy favors the preservation of a rural lifestyle
In planned growth areas, the policy encourages strategic development



# Investment Level

Parcel access is dependent on the investment level per the *Strategies for State Policies and Spending*:

- 1. Level 1 & 2: Direct access only if no reasonable alternative is available (Typically RI-RO)
- 2. Level 3: Direct access up to 200 trips
- 3. Level 4: No new or expanded direct access
