





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Where Pedestrian Crashes Occur


LAND USE CONTEXT & **PEDESTRIAN FATALITIES**



99% OCCURRED ALONG **URBAN ROADWAYS**




1% OCCURRED ALONG **RURAL HIGHWAYS**


RURAL HIGHWAYS

PEDESTRIAN CRASH DENSITY (ALL PEDESTRIAN CRASHES)





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

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Future Action Ideas

Finalize Ped Action Plan – Phase 2

Emerging Priorities

- Implement Complete Streets Design Guide
- Update Safe Routes to School materials
- Increase pilot projects, before and after studies, and pedestrian safety audits
- Assist local governments in identifying funding for pedestrian projects
- Enhance outreach and public education for pedestrian safety awareness and pedestrian-centric design benefits
- Explore options for a consolidated pedestrian projects program



Delaware Pedestrian Action Plan

Purpose: Update the 2007 Delaware Pedestrian Action Plan.

Phase 1 (Draft Finalized - 2023)

- Collect and summarize existing pedestrian plans and DelDOT initiatives
- Began pedestrian crash cluster and connectivity mapping
- Develop project website
- Began Public Involvement

Delaware Pedestrian Action Plan

Phase 2 (Underway now)

- Public outreach
- Internal DelDOT coordination to explore changes to programs and policies

Phase 3 (Fall/Winter 2024)

- Additional pedestrian crash cluster, connectivity and equity mapping
- Additional Public and stakeholder outreach
- Implementation plan with potential new action items, countermeasures, policies, or programs to improve ped connectivity and safety
- Establish performance measures

Public Outreach – In-Person Engagement

- Engaged with **over 150 people.**
 - Rose Hill Community Center (Table Event)
 - Delaware State Fair (Table Event)
 - Fox Run Shopping Center (Pop-Up)
 - Arts in the Park Concert Series at Brecknock Park (Table Event)
 - Dover Days (Table Event)
 - Transit Rider Engagement
 - Dover Transit Center, bus stops, and bus routes




Public Outreach

134 total survey responses were collected between April 3rd and August 8th.

Survey Results

• Approximately 80% of respondents walk to meet their daily needs or to access goods and services

Q7: Are there any areas in your community that you have pedestrian concerns about?



Public Outreach

Survey Results

- Common Discouraging Factors to Walking:
 - Destinations are too far away to walk to
 - Lack of pedestrian infrastructure
 - Poor conditions of pedestrian infrastructure
 - Having to cross roads where cars are driving too fast



Public Priorities from Outreach

• Increasing overall sidewalk / pedestrian network and connectivity of existing facilities



- Improving crosswalks
- Slowing traffic / lowering speed limits
- Increasing the separation between roads and sidewalks
- Improving pedestrian access to parks
- Adding more protected bike lanes



2023 DelDOT Pedestrian Safety Outreach

- DelDOT Pedestrian Coordinator interacted with <u>4,565 people</u> at <u>16 Events</u>
 - Transit Centers and Intersections
 - National Night Out
 - Community Events
 - Athletic Meet
- Emphasizing: <u>Nighttime Visibility</u> and <u>Retroreflective Items</u>







Pedestrian Council Role

How Will the Council Be Involved?

Advise DelDOT by:

- Identifying gaps in the pedestrian system
- Suggesting ideas for improvements to design standards and policies
- Reviewing traffic rules to support pedestrian safety
- Developing strategies for pedestrian safety education and awareness
- Periodic reviews and recommendations to Statewide Pedestrian Action Plan
- Assist with annual pedestrian safety events and outreach initiatives
- Quarterly reviews of pedestrian fatalities to recommend safety improvement ideas
- Submit an annual report of the Council's activities and recommendations

Logistics of the Pedestrian Council

Term limits

- 2-year terms
- Members serve until a replacement is appointed

How many meetings will there be?

- 4-per-year minimum, with more if necessary
- Meetings will be held both virtually and in-person

How will information be shared?

• Kelly Valencik will serve as the Council coordinator/administrator

Pedestrian Council Leadership

The Election Process

"... The Council shall elect a chair from among its members. A chair serves for a 2-year term."

- The chair will be elected by the Council, based on the majority of votes
- Nominations and vote at the spring meeting (April 24 Tentatively)
- Nominations will be accepted up to the next meeting

Pedestrian Council Organization

Potential for Subcommittees

- Subcommittees may be formed to assist with Council duties.
- Subcommittee members are not required to be a Council member.

Quorum Requirements

• To satisfy the quorum requirements, **the majority of members must be in attendance**, not including vacant positions.
