

Delaware Transit Corporation (DTC) Services

Fixed Route Bus Service

- Eleven (11) routes in Sussex County during the resort season (selected routes operate with a peak frequency between 10-30 minutes)
- Three (3) year-round transit routes operate in the study area (Routes 206, 210, 212)
- Inter-county bus route 303 stops on US 113 four times daily
- Hours of service range from 5:00 AM to 12:00 AM
- Service is provided to employment and residential centers, with expanded fixed-route service to the beach communities during resort season (Memorial Day to Labor Day)



Since May 2000, a Federal Matching Grant called Welfare to Work (WTW) totaling \$1.4 Million has been awarded to Delaware to provide better fixed-route transit service to low income residents of Sussex County. In addition, WTW has funded four mobility van pools.

Sussex County Dial-A-Ride

- Provides door-to-fixed-bus-stop service
- Hours of operation are the same as the corresponding fixed-route service
- Available in selected cities and towns: Milford, Georgetown, Seaford, Laurel, Lewes, Rehoboth, and Dewey (see map at left for approximate service areas)

Paratransit

Door-to-door service is provided Countywide for individuals who are ADA qualified. Call 1-800-652-DART.

Park and Ride

DTC operates one park and ride, or park and pool, lot in Georgetown and six lots total in Sussex County.

Specialty Transportation Services

(Not Affiliated with DTC)

CHEER (302-856-5187)

Transports senior citizens between their homes and senior centers or their homes and doctors offices.

Generations Home Care (302-856-7774)

Provides transportation to mostly Medicaid and private customers.

Kent Sussex Industries, Inc. (KSI) (302-422-4014)

KSI is a vocational rehabilitation organization that offers transportation services to it's program participants as a way of helping them to obtain and maintain an optimal level of employment.

Red Cross (302-355-5031)

Provides transportation for ambulatory people of any age to and from their doctor between 7:30 AM and 12:00 PM.

Senior Citizens Affordable Taxi (SCAT)

People 65 or over or who can't operate a motor vehicle can buy \$10 ticket books for \$5 that can be used for privately-operated taxi service. The ticket books can be purchased at any DART transportation store (call 1-800-355-8080 for locations).

Transportation Management Services

TMA Delaware, a Transportation Management Association, is a collective non-profit organization of private corporations and public agencies dedicated to achieving reductions in traffic congestion, improving mobility and air quality, and educating employers and their employees about transportation alternatives. TMA works with employers to promote and implement transportation programs aimed at reducing congestion on Delaware's roadways and providing cost savings to both employers and employees.

TMA also administers DART First State's free statewide ridematching program, RideShare Delaware. The program is targeted at employers and employees statewide and encourages carpooling and vanpooling. RideShare participants are eligible to receive a free ride home from work in emergency situations, plus receive shopping discounts with their Rewards program. Sixty-eight of the program participants work in Sussex County and another seventy live there.
